A BRIEF PROFILE

Narangi Anchalik Mahavidyalaya, a leading Institution of higher education was established in the year 1991 at the Initiative of the people of greater Narangi area. The college located at the easternmost part of Guwahati city has come a long way in spreading higher education covering ethnic and linguistic groups.

The college initially started its classes in the evening shift at Narangi High School on 2nd September '1991. However, within a few months, the college was shifted to its own permanent site in a beautiful spacious compound surrounded by green hillocks. The college has at present, required number of class rooms, library cum reading room, teacher's common room, girls' common room, boys' common room, departmental rooms and a student union office etc. With the completion of a new four storied building the college has now been fully self sufficient in accommodation.

With persistent and co-ordinated efforts of Governing Body and highly qualified teachers, the college has now developed into a full fledged institution providing an excellent opportunity among the teachers and the taught.

The college offers Higher Secondary and Degree Courses in Arts and Commerce. The Higher Secondary (Commerce) will commence w.e.f 2014-2015 academic session while the Degree (Commerce) has been functioning w.e.f. 2012-13 academic session. The college has fourteen departments with a staff consisting 45 dedicated and sincere permanent teachers. Major courses are provided in Arts Stream : English, Assamese, Hindi, Economics, Political Science, Education, History, Geography, Philosophy, Mathematics; and in Commerce Stream : Management, Accountancy and Finance.



In the wake of the changing needs of education, the college has introduced certificate courses, in the following vocational subjects, namely (i) Computer Hardware, (ii) Mobile Phone repairings, (iii) Beautician, (iv) Still/Video Photography, (v) Electrician cum wiremen and (vi) Montessori Teacher Training. The NECT, a leading Institution of technical education of Guwahati city has extended help and co-operation in this regard. Besides students of our college, others too will be allowed to take up the said vocational course at comparatively low fees.

The college has a rich library with reading rooms, besides various departmental forums for enhancing knowledge and interest of students and others.

The untiring efforts of the teachers and others have borne fruits, and students have come out with flying colours in both H.S and TDC final examinations. Our student brought laurel to the college by securing first class first position in Economics (Major), besides getting first classes in various Major subjects regularly. The college has been maintaining an excellent record of academic performance in both Higher Secondary and Degree levels. The Principal, Vice-Principal, teaching staff, office staff and the Governing Body have been working tirelessly to make Narangi Anchalik Mahavidyala, the only institution of its kind, in the easternmost part of Guwahati, as one of the best colleges in the entire Northeast.

The college has come under the Provincialization Act from 1st January 2013.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The academic session commences from August. Admission to the H.S. course is held after the announcement of the H.S.L.C. Examination results and the T.D.C. 1st year Courses after the H.S. Examination results.

Application for admission to the college should be made in the prescribed form available along with the prospectus on payment of Rs. 150/- Forms may be obtained from the office” or by sending a request accompanied by stamped self addressed envelope along with an IPO of **Rs. 150/-** drawn in favour of Principal, Narangi Anchalik Mahavidyalaya, P.O. Narengi, Guwahati–781171. The dates of admission to the various classes are notified after announcement of the H.S.L.C. and HS examination results.

Admission to the college is strictly on merit. All admission to the college are provisional and subject to the approval of the Gauhati University / Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. The college is not responsible if the G.U./AHSEC does not approve the admission of the student on grounds of lack of migrating certificate, eligibility certificate or furnishing of false statements. The college also will not be responsible if there is any problem in GU / AHSEC registration due to late submission of application by the student.

The filled up admission form must be submitted along with attested copies of marksheets and relevant certificates. A candidate seeking admission must appear in an interview on the scheduled date. Candidates shall have to produce the following documents at the time of interview

- (i) Original Admit Card and Marksheets of the examination last appeared.
- (ii) Two copies of recent passport size photographs of the candidate duly attested by gazetted officer or Headmaster / Principal of the institution last attended.
- (iii) SC/ST/OBC/MOBC candidates must produce original copy of the caste certificate. (if any)
- (iv) Proficiency Certificate regarding extra curricular activities. (if any)
- (v) Registration Certificate.
- (vi) In case of a student migrating from other University or Board, an eligibility certificate has to be produced from the University or Board as the case may be.
- (vii) Pass certificate from the Headmaster or Principal of the Institute last attended.
- (viii) Student who passed the qualifying examination earlier than current session will have to submit gap certificate for the period from the head of the Institution last attended.

**UNSUCCESSFUL CANDIDATE**

H. S. and T.D.C. students who failed to get promotion to the next class may apply for admission alongwith fresh candidates as per AHSEC/GU rules.

GENERAL INFORMATION**IDENTITY CARD :**

Every student is issued an identity card at the time of Admission. This card is non transferable and contains information of the holder. It also contains a passport size photograph of the student duly attested by the Principal. The card is essential for every student to carry with him/her so that it can be produced whenever necessary.

LIBRARY CARD :

Every student is issued a library card against which he / she can borrow one book. However major students will be issued one additional card against which one book can be borrowed. Borrowers must return the books– within fifteen days from the date of issue of the books. An overdue charge of fifty paise per day will be levied if a book is kept beyond the due date of return. A borrower will be held responsible for the loss or damage of any book borrowed from the college library.

STUDENTS UNION :

The Narangi Anchalik Mahavidyalaya Students Union is the general body of the students of the college. Its membership is compulsory for every student admitted into the college. The office bearers of the Union are elected annually. The election is conducted as per rules.

THE COLLEGE MAGAZINE :

“The Narangian” is published annually. It gives an opportunity for creativity and self– expression of the students in different fields. An editorial board consisting of members of the teaching staff and students is constituted annually.

PERUSAL OF NOTICE BOARD :

Students should in their own interest read the notices displayed on the Notice Board and be fully aware of the information displayed there.

**N.C.C.**

The college has introduced its own unit of National Cadet Corps. Students of the college can be members of the N.C.C. unit.

MOUNTAINEERING :

The college has introduced a Mountaineering Unit to foster a spirit of adventure among the youths of the college. The unit has relation with the leading adventure sports organization of the Northeast which organizes mountaineering expeditions. Local rock climbing is arranged and high altitude trekking & expeditions are conducted from time to time by the unit. Membership is open to the students of the college only.

N.A.M.G.F. :

The Narangi Anchalik Mahavidyalaya Geographical Forum is a pioneering society formed in the year 2001 by the teachers and student of the Geography Department of the college. The main aim of the forum is to promote Geographical awareness among the student community in particular and to create awareness about geographical environment among the people in general. The Forum has been organizing field study, excursion and departmental group discussions. Its membership is compulsory for students of Geography Deptt. The general students of the college can also become members of the society if interested.

N.A.M.E.F.

Narangi Anchalik Mahavidyalaya English Forum was formed by the teachers and students, of the Eng. Deptt. In the year 2003. The main objective is to create interest and awareness among all students of the English Deptt. in different fields of English literature. Its membership is compulsory for students of English Deptt. The general students can also be its member, if they are interested in taking part in the seminars, workshops etc. arranged by the forum.

S.H.S.T.

With a view to create awareness among the students in particular and the people in general about various historical relics and monuments spread over the country, the department of History of the college has formed the Society for Historical Studies and Tours. It organises regular tours with in and outside Assam to enable the students to get first hand knowledge of the abundant historical places of the country. All the interested students and members of the teaching staff of the college can be members of the society.

WOMEN'S STUDY AND RESEARCH CENTRE NARANGI ANCHALIK MAHAVIDYALAYA :

The women's study and Research Centre was started under UGC guidelines mainly for the development of women, basically in the Higher Education Section. It basically stresses on women's study, perspective, governance, academics, leadership, management of personal and professional roles.

**NAVARANG :**

“Navarang”, the Commerce Forum, is a platform for the students and faculty members of the Faculty of Commerce, Narangi Anchalik Mahavidyalaya. Navarang came into existence in the year of 2014 with the vision of ‘ Bulding Strong & Sustainable Foundation for the Society’. The membership is compulsory for all the students and faculty members of the Faculty of Commerce. Membership is also open to other Teachers & Students of the college on voluntary basis.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME :

The National Service Scheme unit of the college initiated in the year 2014 is activity engaged in various community services in and around the college. Interested students can contact the Programme Officer.

COLLEGE EXAMINATION :

Continuous assessment of the students is done by the deptts, through regular test, seminar, projects and assignments. The marks obtained by the students at these assessments, are taken into consideration at the time of sending the students for final examination. The Examination Committee’s decision in this regard is final and binding.

- (i) Unit test examination will be held according to routine.
- (ii) Sessional tests will be held according to the programme of the college authority.
- (iii) Final examinations of T.D.C. classes will be held as per G.U. rules.
- (iv) AHSEC and University Examinations will be held according to their programmes.
- (v) A student failing to attend classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes will forfeit his / her seat.
- (vi) All students must – appear in all the examinations conducted by the college during an academic year.

CLASS ATTENDANCE :

A student is to attend at least 75% of the total classes held in a year. Student attending less than 60% classes will be treated as discollegiate and will not be able to appear in the final examination of the University / AHSEC.

INCENTIVES FROM THE COLLEGE :

- (1) Gold medal will be awarded to students securing first class in Major course.
- (2) Gold medal will be awarded to students securing first class in General degree course.
- (3) Cash prize will be awarded to students securing 60% marks in H. S. 1st year and final examination conducted by AHSEC.
- (4) Gold medals will be awarded to student of the college securing highest marks in any subjects in the H.S. Final Examination.
- (5) Scholarship facilities for SC/ST students are admissible as per Govt. Rules.
- (6) Students securing First Division are exempted from tuition fees on the Scheduled date of admission.

PROCEDURE FOR INTERNAL EVALUATION :

- (1) The marks allotted for internal evaluation (20%) in each paper will be based on the following:
 - (a) Sessional Examination I
 - (b) Sessional Examination II
 - (c) Home Assignment, Seminars and Group Discussion, or related work depending on the decision of the teachers/college concerned. Home assignment etc. (as in (c) above) may be given to the student at any time during the semester. These may be regarded as one question (out of four) in each of the sessional examination and marked accordingly. Thus (c) above is a part of the sessional examinations and the total internal marks in a-c above would be 20% of the marks allotted to the paper.
2. Each sessional examination will be of one hour duration and be conducted by the concerned teacher of each paper. The setting of question paper, invigilation duty, evaluation of answer scripts for each paper will be done by the concerned teacher(s) as a part of his/her normal duty.



3. The teacher concerned will fix the exact date of the sessional examination in each paper following the guidelines of academic schedule. Each sessional examination will be of one hour duration and the students should write the examination in proper University answer books.
4. After evaluation the answer scripts should be shown to the students and corrections should be made if there are any. After this, the answer scripts should be collected back from the students. The entire process of evaluation of a sessional examination should not take more than two weeks from the date of examination.
5. There is no provision for re-appearing or “repeat”/ “betterment” in the sessional examination. If a student miss one or both examination for valid reasons (as evidenced by medical certificate or other authentic documents) then the teacher / college concerned may allow the student a separate examinations using the teachers own discretion.
6. If a paper is taught by more than one teacher then the concerned teacher should cooperated in conducting the internal evaluation. However, since the contents of a paper in semester examination is approximately half that of a full paper in annual examination, it is strongly recommended that one paper in a semester system be taught by only one teacher.

GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE :

- (1) Student must be in college Uniform as prescribed by the college authority while in college.
- (2) The college lays special emphasis on the maintenance of discipline and proper-decorum in and outside the classroom.
- (3) Students are expected to show proper respect to their teachers, be polite with one another and show courtesy to the employees of the college.
- (4) In order to create proper academic atmosphere in the college, students should not make noise while moving in the college campus, reading room or in the common room.
- (5) Notice desired to be pasted or circulated by the student within the college premises requires prior approval of the Principal.



(6) **SMOKING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED IN THE COLLEGE CAMPUS.**

All powers for maintaining discipline are vested with the Principal and his/her decision shall be final on all such matters.

SOME IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS :

- (1) Be regular in attending your classes.
- (2) Look up, at the notice board daily as soon as you come and before you leave the college.
- (3) Keep the college premises clean and tidy.
- (4) Cheewing of betelnut, taking pan masala, chewing gums etc inside the college campus are strictly prohibited.
- (5) Students found moving around the verandahs without any valid reason when classes are on, will lead to strict disciplinary action.
- (6) **Use of Mobile Phone is strictly prohibited inside the classroom and on the verandahs of the college. Improper use of Mobile Phone within the college premises will be severely dealt with.**
- (7) Writing and sticking bills on the walls are strictly prohibited.
- (8) Donot spit on the walls and in the class rooms, do not write or stick anything on the walls or desks and benched. Any one caught red-handed will be punished.
- (9) Each student must carry the college indentity card, It is to be brought to the college daily and is to be produced when asked for.
